GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & GRADE SYSTEM

To graduate, **students must earn a minimum of 24 credits**. All students must complete American Literature, World History, United States History, Government and Economics, Biology with Lab, Chemistry with Lab, and Physics with Lab. World language credits must be in the same language and taken at the high school level.

- 75% of students participate in Pre-IB, Pre-AP, Honors, Advanced, AP, or IB classes
- Students enroll in 6-7 courses per semester
- Dual enrollment options are available through the University of Miami and other local colleges to students in grades 11-12

Gulliver does not rank students. The rigor of a student's curriculum and individual academic achievement is discussed in a personal letter of recommendation.

GPA reflects academic subjects, upper level visual arts, and performing arts conservatory courses taken at Gulliver Prep. The following weighing system is used in determining GPAs:

TESTING PROFILE

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

Admission to the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) is based on student's prior academic performance and requires departmental chair approval.

- 36% of Upper School students participate in the IBDP
- students must complete 3HL and 3 SL courses, TOK, EE, and CAS
- Students enrolled in IB courses must sit for the examinations
- **Class of 2024:** 70 students graduated with the International Baccalaureate Diploma, including 30 with Bilingual Diploma
- Class of 2025: 95 IBDP candidates
- Class of 2026: 85 IBDP candidates

Advanced Placement

Admission to AP courses is based on students' prior academic performance and requires department chair recommendation. Gulliver Prep permits students in grade 10 to take one AP course. Students who enroll in AP courses must sit for the national examinations.


