Conrad Challenge Semifinalists

Four teams from the Upper School's Engineering, Biomedical Science, and Computer Science Department have advanced to the semifinal round of this year's Conrad Challenge. An annual multiphase innovation and entrepreneurship competition, the Conrad Challenge encourages young adults to participate in designing the future through purposedriven education. It challenges students to come up with an innovation to solve a realworld problem, a concept that Gulliver students are familiar with as they strive to make a real impact on the world. Gulliver Prep teams have won the Conrad Challenge six times, and will look to make it seven when the winners are announced on February 12. Remembering Dr. King

To recognize Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Day, Mrs. Lang's fifth and sixth grade students created an educational exhibit on the windows of classroom G-3. Students and faculty can learn more about Dr. King through the photos, quotes, facts, and videos (accessed via QR codes), on display. Both in-person and remote learners participated in the project, as on-campus students researched and wrote out facts and quotes, and those learning from home created photo collages and emailed them to Mrs. Lang to print and display. Students also searched the internet for appropriate and factually correct videos about Dr. King in order to create OR codes that could be scanned for viewing.

Arctic Animal Extractions in PK

PK students have embarked on a mini study on the Arctic, the Eskimos who live there, what they wear every day to survive in cold conditions, and how Arctic animals' blubber keeps them warm. Students are able to put their math, science, literacy, STEM, and problem solving skills to work during a "cool" lesson, as they test out different ways to extract animals from igloos. Last week, they used a hammer and a nail, and this week, they will try a different method of extraction by utilizing "snow potion" (a combination of vinegar, baking soda, and water). Using scientific inquiry skills, students will compare what happens when plain water is used versus the snow potion, and then answer the question, "do you think the snow potion will help you release the animal faster or slower than using the hammer and nail?" Having just learned about tallying, each student will tally their answer on a chart, and explain why they chose faster or slower before witnessing the chemical reaction from the snow potion.
