






Coach DeCesare Records 500th Win



A Real-World Lesson on Parabolas

In a study on parabolas, students in Mrs. Amy Biscombe's Algebra 2 class connected classroom learning to the real world, using methods learned in class to explore and find a quadratic model for a real-world situation. Students were tasked with taking a photo with an object they found, inserting it into the Desmos graphing calculator, and deriving and graphing an equation to describe and model the parabola. They then calculated the vertex form of a quadratic function to model a real-world situation, and expanded the vertex form to determine properties of the graph written in standard form. By comparing both functions, students checked their quadratic function by checking the function with the object they selected.
