




Teachers, Students Create Division-Wide Black History Month Virtual Museum

The month-long endeavor aimed to highlight the contributions of Black Americans across all academic disciplines, and resulted in a creative, comprehensive Black History Month Virtual Museum. From student-led interviews and panel discussions, to art exhibitions and history lessons in many forms, each academic class developed a project related to its specific subject matter that demonstrated the achievements and accomplishments of Black Americans.
